WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS FUN FACTS

The United States is comfortably the most successful nation at the World Championships, with **195** gold, **134** silver and **114** bronze medals up to 2023, for a total of 443. It seems certain that this country will win a 200th gold in Tokyo 2025. Six other countries have more than 100 medals, in order the Germanies, Kenya, Jamaica, Russia, Great Britain & NI and Ethiopia. Japan's total is 35 (eight gold, nine silver and 18 bronze). The country with the most medals but no golds yet are the 2023 hosts Hungary, with 15 medals in all, seven silvers and eight bronzes.

The biggest World Athletics Championships in terms of athletes is Budapest 2023 with 1994 participants from 194 countries plus the Athlete Refugee Team. The most teams with at least one starter, 206, appeared at the 2019 edition in Doha. That included 204 countries, plus Authorised Neutral Athletes from Russia and the Athlete Refugee Team. The championships with the most countries winning gold medals is Eugene 2022 with 29. The record for the number of countries winning medals is 46, at Osaka 2007 and Budapest 2023. The 2023 edition also saw a record number of countries providing finalists, 82.

The first full, autonomous World Championships in Athletics were staged in 1983 in Helsinki. Until then, World Athletics declared that the Olympic Games should serve as their World Championships. Therefore, two World Athletics Presidents were World Champions. Lord Burghley (David Cecil), president in 1946-1976, was the 1928 champion at 400m Hurdles. Sebastian Coe's 1500m win at Moscow 1980 meant that the current World Athletics President was both Olympic Champion and (until 1983) World Champion at that event.

The most championships contested is 13 by 50 kilometre walker Jesús Ángel García (ESP). The most by a woman is 11 by another race walker, Susana Feitór (POR).

The bib which has won most World Championship golds is number 510. First when triple jumper Philips Idowu (GBR) wore it in 2009, and then five more times by one athlete: Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce (JAM). She was issued with that number at Moscow 2013, where she won the sprint treble. Then, by chance, she got 510 again at Beijing 2015 where she won the 100m and 4x100m. Five different athletes have won World titles (one each) with bib number 956.

The four athletes with the most World Championship medals are Allyson Felix (USA), Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce (JAM), Merlene Ottey (JAM/SLO) and Usain Bolt (JAM). Felix has 20 medals across the 200m, 400m and three types of relays. This includes one awarded after she ran the heats only of the 2022 women's 4x400m, her final race. Fraser-Pryce has a total of 16 medal from the 100m, 200m and 4x100m. Both Ottey and Bolt collected 14 medals, also from sprints and relays.

Considering individual titles only, Usain Bolt is top of the list with seven golds. Four at 200m and three at 100m. Bolt also holds the men's record for the most races contested at the World Championships, 44 including relays. He won 33 of those. The overall record is 59 races by Merlene Ottey (JAM/SLO).

Six individual World Championship golds and no defeats is a record Sergey Bubka (URS/UKR) and Michael Johnson (USA) both have. They only ever won gold medals and were never beaten in a final at the championships. Johnson won at 200m & 400m. In Bubka's case, it was in a single event (the Pole Vault) and included the era in 1983-1991 when the championships were only staged every four years.

Considering races run over 200m and 400m, only three golds have ever been won from the innermost two lanes. Ed Moses (USA) won the 400m Hurdles in 1983 from lane 2, Olga Bryzgina (URS) won the women's flat 400m in 1987 from lane 2 and Cathy Freeman (AUS) won the same event from lane 1 in 1997. Four golds have been won from the outermost lane: The 1987 men's 200m (Calvin Smith (USA), lane 8), the 1997 men's 4x100m (Canada, lane 8), the 2015 men's 400m Hurdles (the late Nicholas Bett (KEN), lane 9) and the 2017 women's 400m Hurdles (Kori Carter (USA), lane 9).

The most popular family name for World Championship competitors is Williams, with 73 athletes having that name. Next is Smith (46), Li (45), Garcia (43) and Kim (39). World Champions with the name Williams include Bernard, Danielle, Diane, Jesse, Lauryn, Novlene and Tonique.

The first World Champion at Helsinki 1983 was the legendary marathoner Grete Waitz (NOR), but there were three champions at earlier separate events arranged by World Athletics outside the Olympic Games. First a men's 50 Kilometres Walk at Malmö in 1976. The International Olympic Committee had dropped the event from the programme of the Montreal Olympics, so it was agreed that Sweden would organise a separate world championship race after those 1976 Games. That is how Venyamin Soldatenko (URS) became the first-ever World Champion outside of cross country. Attempts by athletics to add a 3000m and 400m Hurdles to the women's schedule for the 1980 Games failed, so later that month, in Sittard, there were two world championship events, both won by Germans. Birgit Friedmann (FRG) took the 3000m and Bärbel Broschat (GDR) the 400m Hurdles.

The most world records at a World Championship is five at Stuttgart 1993. Colin Jackson at the 110m Hurdles (12.91), both men's relays (USA 37.40 & 2:54.29), Sally Gunnell at 400m Hurdles (52.74), and Anna Biryukova (RUS) at Triple Jump (15.09). That men's 4x400m time, which Michael Johnson anchored with a world best split of 42.94, remains the world record as we head into Tokyo 2025.

The longest-standing championship records are both from Helsinki 1983 and both by the same athlete, Czechoslovakia's Jarmila Kratochvílová. On August 9 she won the 800m in 1:54.68 and then on the 10th the 400m in 47.99. That was the first world record to be set at the championships.

The oldest World Champion is Ellina Zvereva (BLR), winner of the 2001 Discus Throw at 40 years 269 days. The oldest male champion is Yohann Diniz (FRA), winner of the 2017 50 kilometres walk at 39 years 224 days. The youngest is Merlene Frazer (JAM) who at 17 years 248 days was part of the winning Jamaican 4x100m squad in 1991. The youngest individual champion is Tirunesh Dibaba (ETH), 5000m winner in 2003 at 17 years 333 days. The youngest male champion is Ismael Kirui (KEN), 5000m winner in 1993 at 18 years 177 days.

The only case of a shared gold medal as been that of the 2023 women's Pole Vault, when Katie Moon (USA) and Nina Kennedy (AUS) agreed on that outcome rather than contesting a jump off. On two occasions at the World Championships there have been jump-offs, the 1997 women's High Jump and 2015 men's High Jump. There have been numerous ties for second and third places in both track and field events at past World Championships. At Doha 2019, two events (the men's 110m Hurdles and Hammer Throw) featured two bronze medallists as it was judged that those awarded extra medals had been disadvantaged during the course of the competition.
